Imagine you're a buyer, standing in front of an apartment that interests you. With two clicks you can view the amenities in the immediate vicinity — restaurants, banks, bars, gas stations and more. This takes the user beyond home/rental search and to-

ward an answer to the question that really matters: "Can I live here?" The app also allows the user to call any business listing or email, Tweet, or save one.



MagicPlan

This app which allows you to create custom floors plans by moving your phone or iPad around the room taking pictures. It's hard to explain, but essentially — you just use the camera to move around the room, and it automatically maps out the room. To see a video of this thing in action, click here.

This app is great because you can quickly and easily make floor plans. Three great uses for this are:

- Rehabbers can make house plans to use before a heavy re-model and to help plan for materials
- Landlords can make quick floor plans to include on their Craigslist or website listings
- When selling a property, you can now include floor plans in your marketing material.

In Remembrance

MARK R. MCDONALD

On October 28, 2013, Mark R. McDonald passed away after a long, tough battle with Crohn's disease and congestive heart failure.

Mark was born on September 6, 1947 in Ann Arbor, Ml. He grew up in the Burns Park neighborhood. As a youth, Mark loved to play hockey. He played and was captain of the Ann Arbor Pioneer hockey team from 1961-1965. After high school, Mark continued to play hockey with a semi-pro hockey team in Mar-



quette, Ml. In 1974, Mark graduated from Eastern Michigan University with degrees in Political Science and English. After college, Mark began work with Wilson White Co., a local property management firm, after responding to an ad in the paper. Mark worked for Wilson White Co. for over three decades, from 1975 until 2006, eventually becoming the company's President and CEO.

In 2006, Mark left Wilson White Co. and started his own property management firm, McDonald Management, along with his wife, Judy McDonald. Mark was very active in helping the community through his commitment to numerous local organizations. Mark was a founding director of the Ann Arbor Apartment Association in 1983, where he later served on the Board of Directors as both the Vice President and the President. Mark also served as a Director of the Property Management Association of Michigan and the Ann Arbor Board of Realtors.

In 2012, Mark received a Lifetime Achievement Award in recognition of his contributions to the Property Management Association of Michigan. Mark was dedicated to providing homes to everyone, especially those in need. In 2009, Mark received an award for his contributions and service with the nonprofit group SOS Community Services, where he helped provide homeless families with access to food, housing, and shelter. When Mark wasn't working, he spent most of his time with his family and friends. Mark and his wife, Judy, spent a lot of their time at their cottage in Houghton Lake, a place he visited since he was child. He was the host of many family gatherings and made annual trips to Tip Up Town USA with his best friend, Tom Lovell. Tom and Mark also enjoyed vacationing with their families in the Bahamas, where they spent time fishing and celebrating life. Mark is survived by his wife, Judy; daughter, Heather; stepson, Aaron; sisters, Laura, Katie, and Sue; his grandson, Jalen; and his dog, Max. He was preceded in death by his mother, Marilyn; daughter, Katie; and brother, Scott. Mark and his family are very thankful for the loving care he received from the staff at Evangelical Homes in Saline through journey's end.

Partnering with EMU:

Eastern Michigan University is preparing a checklist that all rental housing providers can fill out that will be posted to the university website regarding safety measures. They have started an initiative to better inform students of what rental housing is and to provide them with more information before they begin searching for their off-campus housing. The association is partnering with the University to prepare the safety checklist and partnering with EMU on their one and only housing fair.

R4C Zoning Advisory Re-committee:

Chuck Carver represented the apartment association on an Advisory committee for the City of Ann Arbor that explored downzoning initiative in certain areas from R4C to R2A and provided the planning department with reasonable recommendations. We say re-committee because just when we thought it was done, a new advisory committee was formed and a select group choose to re-evaluate what the planning commission proposed to council. Chuck was unable to represent our group again so Jay Holland stepped in to ensure the gains that we made in the first committee were not dissolved the second time around. We have written a letter to the City Council with our position to support the planning commission in their original recommendation.

recommend changes to the rental housing communities that would make them more energy efficient. We are particularly concerned about what could come from this initiative so we have volunteered 6 members to be part of a taskforce looking at possible initiatives that either they or you would fund to decrease energy usage. This is particularly interesting timing given that the City of Ann Arbor is looking at updating their housing codes. We are going to make sure one has nothing to do with the other.

Amicus Brief to support "Chronic Late Payment" clause:

Recently Judge Simpson announced in his court he would not be upholding the "Chronic Late Payment" clause as a viable defense for eviction. The case he opined on has been appealed and the association paid for a supporting amicus brief that would require all courts to allow the "Chronic Late Payment" as an appropriate lease clause.

Early Lease Signing Ordinance Survey:

The University of Michigan Grad Students government has agreed to produce and distribute to all University of Michigan students a survey about what they (the students) think of the Early Lease Signing Ordinance. We are participating with them to ensure a (mostly) unbiased survey goes out. We will keep you posted on the results.

Alpha House Initiative:

Alpha Housing and multiple social agencies are reaching out to the rental housing community to find housing for hard to house individuals. They have grant money that will fund **housing and full time services** for individuals. What they don't have is a stream of rental housing options at their disposal. If you missed the free landlord breakfast on November 12th, you will have another opportunity to learn about their initiative over the next few months. They will be speaking at our one of our upcoming meetings.
